Interim Executive Director's Report

Date of Meeting: September 7, 2022

Comments: Interim Executive Director Olivette Simpson briefed the Commissioners on the series of companion resolutions that were to be presented for consideration and introduced Brownfield Redevelopment Solutions Principal Michele Christina who provided an update on remediation activity at the Elijah Perry Park Site. This is the final phase of CRA's assistance to the City of Camden and the Housing Authority of the City of Camden (HACC) in relation to their work over the last five years in the Centerville/Mt. Ephraim Area under the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) CHOICE Initiative Grant. In response to the funding gap identified in connection with completion of the Park Site, which is located in the Branch Village Neighborhood/Branches of Centerville, CRA seeks to provide funds through its Revolving Loan Fund (RLF) to carryout plans for the park that were developed in consultation with residents, the City of Camden, and Camden Community Partnership. To date, \$1.8 million has been provided by HUD as well as \$400,000.00 through a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG).

This five-acre site is located at Ferry Avenue and Phillips Street. Updated basketball courts, a baseball diamond, water spray area, and other amenities are proposed.

Ms. Christina covered: Background on the RLF accrued with grants from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), which have grown from \$819,379.00 in 2013 to \$3.5 million in October 2022, Sites Funded to Date (6) and Potentially Funded Sites (9), a Remediation Overview for Elijah Perry Park, as well as the Funding Approach for the project. In addition to RLF grants, CRA plans to utilize Hazardous Discharge Site Remediation Funds (HDSRF). The estimated remediation cost is approximately \$1,091,26.00. Upon completion of the remediation, park construction can commence. The anticipated deadline for project completion is December 2023. Photos of existing structures were presented along with comps of the future park design.

Prior to the Caucus, a Finance Committee meeting was held and a recommendation to proceed was obtained.
