## blic Comments

Chairman Bowman opened the floor for public comments at 6:10 PM.

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Republican Committeeman Rev. Eddie Torres, who advised that he represents over 1,000 voters in Camden, appealed to the Board for respect comparable to his stature. He raised several questions:

He questioned the Board's public engagement practice(s) and specifically asked: If the public cannot express views at the Caucus meeting or prior to the vote at the Monthly Meetings, how can they convey feelings?

Mr. Torres also requested a contact list for Board Members, including email addresses to permit better communication.

He questioned how much CRA is investing in communities in proportion to proceeds raised through the sale of properties/development activity(ies).

What is the application process for development? If CRA is operating without a formal application process, Mr. Torres recommends the creation of one.

Will an auction take place for the Lanning Square projects? This will lead to delivery of fair market value. According to Rev. Torres, it is CRA's responsibility to generate as much revenue as possible through sales.

ivir. R. Mangaliso Davis of the African-American Advisory Commission congratulated Chairman Bowman on his election. He also inquired about several resolutions.

Resolution A—Is the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act "stimulus" funding? Director Johnson confirmed.

Resolution B—What services will be performed at Lanning Square? Director Johnson informed Mr. Davis the Board has directed Staff to seek fair market value on sales; the appraisals will help to determine the market value. Mr. Davis asked for details on the large properties a contractor is being retained to develop? Director Johnson informed Mr. Davis that a contractor has/will not been designated prior to the issuance of an RFP/RFQ, following the development of short-term stimulus-funded development priorities. Mr. Davis inquired about CRA's intent to build houses there. Director Johnson noted, whatever is done with the property will be an eligible activity of the NSP2 grant; it may include building and/or demolishing houses, land banking, greening, et cetera.

Discussion ensued regarding the 20 properties to be acquired.

Mr. Davis inquired about which community based group is CRA partnering with. Director Johnson explained, prior the acquisition must first take place, then community engagement will occur.

Mr. Davis encouraged Ms. Johnson to secure details regarding the history of CRA's impact in Lanning Square via Commissioner Quinones and President Moran. Director Johnson offered to meet with Mr. Davis and requested his assistance in identifying individuals who should be part of the discussion.

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Commissioner Pena clarified the scope of the Resolution. She recommended Mr. Davis attend Caucus meetings, because consideration of the community impact of development initiatives is deliberated extensively.

Resolution G-What changes does CRA seek to make to the existing redevelopment plan? Director Johnson explained the Consultant will explore whether amending usage of approximately 115 parcels of land is appropriate.

Considerable discussion ensued regarding the boundaries and prospective uses of the land.

Mr. Davis inquired about why funds are being expended to explore development that has not been requested by the residents? He emphasized residents want a supermarket. Director Johnson noted there are parties interested in the development of a retail entity. Commissioner Sanchez stated a portion of the land will be designated for a charter school.

Mr. Asselta clarified this process permits proper assessment to determine uses; it is subject to Planning Board approval.

Mr. Davis noted a charter school is under consideration close to these borders and the prospective developer from Chester is poorly performing. He encouraged the Board to devote more consideration to minority hiring/contracting practices.

Gary Frazier of TK-Affiliation, asked: Is CRA's housing development tied to the new Urban Act? Housing Director Olivette Simpson advised that she was not familiar with the bill.

He also requested details about how funds are being reinvested in the community.

commissioner Pena recommended distribution of CRA's NSP2 report.

Mr. Asselta advised Mr. Frazier to officially request the documents via OPRA with City Clerk's Office.

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Laverne Williams of 218 Branch Village posed several questions:

How much ARRA funds were allocated for CRA? When were the funds received? What's the spending deadline? Director Johnson reported CRA's award from HUD is \$11.9 and \$600,000 was derived through the EPA. The next NSP2 related spending deadline is February 13, 2012.

She also asked: What is the cost for the title search at Lanning Square? Ms. Simpson noted the cost is \$9,000,00.

Regarding Resolution G, she inquired about the cost. Ms. Simpson reported it is \$24,900. Director Johnson noted it is ERB-funded, not ARRA.

Regarding Resolution J, Ms. Williams inquired about how the change order compares to the original contract. Mr. Harveson noted the original contract was \$10,000 and the additional spending is \$2,000.

Ms. Williams recommended CRA incorporate financial details in resolution titles.

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She concluded by recommending a relocation strategy for current Lanning Square residents.

ank Fullbrook of 211 Penn Street inquired about Resolution D. Ms. Simpson reiterated work has been underway for at least six months and several community meetings have been conducted. She offered to arrange for Mr. Fullbrook to attend the next.

Mr. Fullbrook noted, whatever is done just north of the bridge will affect those living south of the bridge.

He also inquired about the former state prison site. Mr. Harveson reported divesture requires authorization. In order to transfer the land to EDA, additional legislation is required.

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Colandus "Kelly" Francis of the NAACP distributed articles regarding responsibilities of property owners. He also posed a question about Resolution F: Have the properties to be acquired been identified? Ms. Simpson reported there are 13 scattered sites in Cooper Plaza and Lanning Square as well as 3 in North Camden.
